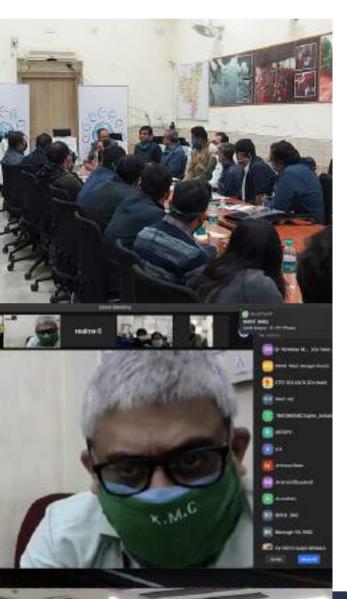

MANT has established a Hand Woven Garment Production cum Training Unit through its sister concern i.e Prantik Entrepreneurs Pvt. Ltd. It has been in business since 2016 . The unit is run by the tribal women. Recently SFURTI scheme has been implemented under Prantik Handloom and Handicraft Development Cluster where little less than 400 rural women artisans will benefited

Covid-19 Awareness Program

A series of **30 episodes on COVID-19** have been developed and broadcast in collaboration with Community Radio Association with the support from UNICEF from June – October. 2020. The episodes were made on 10 specific issues:

- -Overall Information on COVID19
- -Using Mask
- -Home Quarantine
- -Home Care during Quarantine
- -Maintaining Physical Distance
- -Importance of staying at home
- -Protect elderly to reduce risk of COVID-19
- -Proper Nutrition during COVID-19
- -COVID 19 and Food Safety
- -Breastfeeding during COVID-19

Programmes on Tobacco use vis-à-vis chances of COVID-19 infection:

MANT has broadcast programmes on Tobacco Cessation, Promos on relative risks of Tobacco use vis-à-vis chances of COVID-19 infection AND also Live Phone-in Programmes on Psychological Support, Counselling and the like by involving eminent Psychologists and Psychiatrists including Tobacco Cessation Experts From April 2020 to September 2020.





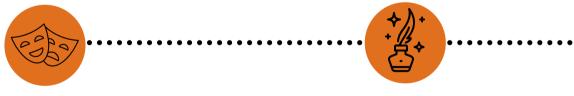
Child Protection during COVID-19

Since August 2020, Community Radio has aired several programmes on Child Protection issues, like precautionary measures, psychosocial support and care for children in COVID-19 Era, Child Online abuses and Cyber bullying, Child rights during Covid, violence against children, gender violence, child marriage, right to participation, mental health of children during pandemic etc. The programmes were developed in the form of Interactive Session, Radio Drama and Jingles with the support of UNICEF, CRY and Sanlaap.



Ajker Tara (Today's Star)

A unique programme was launched under the tale of 'Ajker Tara', where people have been encouraged to share positive health behavior they have adopted to prevent COVID-19. More than 100 people have shared their stories till date.



Koutuk Naksha (Funny Skits)

A series of drama were developed and aired in the form funny skits to create awareness on COVID-19.

Jingles on COVID-19

In collaboration with Niti Aayog, Jingles on COVID-19 were aired in local languages.



Programmes on AYUSH:

Special Programmes on Ayush has been broadcast with a special focus on immunity through food and nutrition.



Media Campaigning

Media campaigning was introduced under the banner **#StemTheTideTogether** in collaboration with District Administration and others. The prepared IEC materials are mostly in vernacular languages i.e. in Bengali and Santhali.



Promotional Posts on Social Media Platforms of CRS:

Various IEC materials, carousal posts, promotional videos in relation to COVID-19 were made as part of awareness generation in social medias, youtube and the like.

Besides, regular programmes on Covid-19, Precautionary Measures, Community Infection, Migration, Special care to elderly people, children or pregnant women etc. have been broadcast. Community people and Govt. officials have participated in radio programmes to share their experiences during COVID.

Strengthening Adolescent Public Awareness and Maternal Nutrition Campaign on Fine

In collaboration with CINI, 5 Episodes of a radio drama were developed on adolescent and maternal nutrition with an aim to improve nutrition status of women & adolescents by ensuring community engagement process.



Public Awareness Campaign on Financial Education Message

In collaboration with RBI, five audio messages of 30 seconds each in Bengali and Santhali language were broadcast 5 times a day for the period of one month in September, 2020. The messages are about fictitious emails, safe digital banking, risk vs. returns, banking ombudsman and RBI Limited liability.



Radio Drama on Child Trafficking

In collaboration with My Choices Foundation, 15 radio dramas on child trafficking was developed and aired in Bengali.



Online Classes

Sidhu-Kanho-Birsha University and NCERT have conducted online classes through community radio for university and school students respectively.



Promotion of Central Govt. Schemes

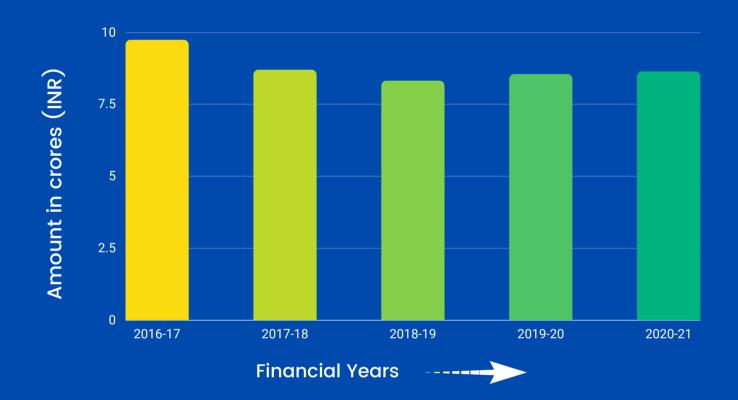
The radio station produced and broadcast 4 Programmes of a duration of 15 minutes on the schemes and Atmanirbhar programme of Central Govt. in collaboration with Vikaspedia. A webinar was organised for the stakeholders of Purulia district including Govt. officials / service providers, and individuals associated in social development sector and a jingle was made for the promotion of Vikaspedia.

for the period of April 2020 - March, 2021 including nearly 1 Lakh coverage through social media platforms

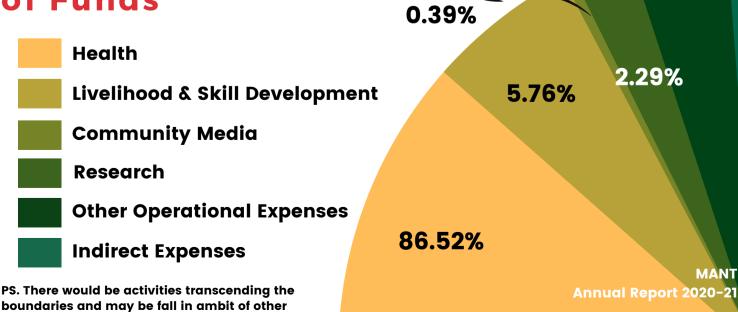


LAST 5 YEARS YoY TURNOVER
